HELP FOR YOUNG CARERS

A big thanks to Anne Patterson who spoke to us about her work supporting young carers aged 16 + and giving us information to pass on to any young people who could use the service. You must be unwaged and not in training to benefit. There was a little discussion around the fact that some young people arnt aware they are carers. We will distribute the leaflets wherever we can.

MONEY FOR VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS

There is still money in the YAB pot for voluntary organisations we will ask Lynn and Momentum to advertise this for us.

NEWS FROM BURGH COUNCIL

The group was informed that the Burgh Council no longer had the capacity to hold the YAB budget. Momentum who already hold our budget for Voluntary organisations has been approached. A draft service level agreement was circulated and the group agreed unanimously that they should be the new holders of our budget

Discussion then followed as to what does the Burgh Council do for young people. Alive leisure which a lot of young people use is now a charity. The group decided to write to the council and ask them for a list of the work they do with young people this will be arranged at the next Kings Lynn meeting. There was no representative from the Burgh Council at the meeting.

YOUTH SNAPS

The group received information on how the youth Safer Neibourghood Partnership Meetings are working in schools. Bob reported that they have managed to get 2 going in different schools that it was early days but two issues are currently being dealt with faulty lighting on the Multi sports area outside Fairstead community centre. That a lot of young people felt unsafe as they walked to school because of speeding vehicles we are in the early stages of discussing a drive safe campaign. There will be a fuller report on these, at the next meeting.

Ella was to look into how first aid training through the college might be made more available to young people who do not attend the college

NEXT YEARS PLAN

The group reported that it had been doing the preparatory work for the big plan and had reached the stage that it needed some facts and figures to back up what is being asked for. Lynn said if we let her know exactly what figures we are looking for she probably has them in the 0-19 years' health profile. They hope that a draft plan will be available for the next meeting

Some of the considerations and evidence that will be used in the plan will come from questionnaires. Recently we have been asking why 3 voluntary youth clubs have now closed.

Do adults working with young people in their leisure time have any qualifications or training in this area

Are we looking at what young people really want or are we just trying to prevent Juvenile nuisance?

Are public areas maintained well enough? Can they be made more accessible for young people?

We need to make sure we have all the appropriate evidence to support the plan
