What is Momentum Small Grants and Funding?

Momentum (Norfolk) is funded by Norfolk County Council to award small grants of up to £500 to voluntary clubs, groups, and organisations working with young people aged 11-19 years in Norfolk.

There are **FOUR** types of Momentum grants available for you to apply for up to **two times** per financial year!

Start Up -

This grant is for setting up a new youth group for 11–19-year-olds and can include the costs of DBS checks, insurance, venue hire, and set up costs.

Activity / Project -

This grant is for specific activities or a project that benefits young people, such as an outreach project, a camping trip, or planned series of events.

Equipment / Resources -

This grant is for equipment or resources for your group such as a pool table, chairs, games consoles, and games or computer equipment.

Training & Development -

You can use this grant to cover the cost of training for your staff and volunteers' professional development. This grant can also be used to pay towards the Level 2 and 3 Youth Work qualification.

What are the Momentum Grant Guidelines? Who Can Apply?

- Groups / organisations are expected to show that they are operating safely and have achieved or are working towards.
 Strong Foundations.
- Groups / organisations must be working with 11-19-year-olds and the grant must be of benefit to the 11-19-year-olds and the grant must be of benefit to the 11-19-year-olds.
- Groups must have a bank account in the group's name with two unrelated signatories. Payments will not be made to individuals accounts. If you don't have a bank account in your organisation's name, then please contact us.
 - Applications and evaluations are assessed by Young Commissioners from the Youth Advisory Boards.
 - Successful applications must spend the approved grant within 12 months of being notified of their successful application.

(If there is any issue with spending your grant within the allotted timeframe, please contact us).

- In the event of a group closing, assets purchased with small grants **may** be given to a similar group (also in the Voluntary Norfolk network) at the **discretion of Momentum**.
- Momentum (Norfolk) has the right to recover capital goods or revenue funding if the recipient is seen not to comply with the terms of the grant.

How Can I Apply for A Momentum Grant at my Group / Organisation?

We have recently moved to a **rolling programme** to enable groups to apply at **any time** during the year.



Things to consider when applying for Momentum Grants and Funding...


- Momentum (Norfolk) Grants are assessed by Young Commissioners from the Youth Advisory Boards.
- Momentum is part of Voluntary Norfolk, and you must have joined the <u>Voluntary Norfolk Network</u> to apply. (This is completely FREE to do).
- Please allow **12 weeks** for a decision to be made and funds to be released (we cannot fund activities that have already taken place).
- You will be expected to show receipts for the **full** amount with your evaluation.

Our **simple** and **straightforward** application form has 4 sides for you to fill in so we can see how you would like to use the grant, how much you would like to apply for, and **most importantly** see if you have engaged with your **young people** and collected evidence to highlight why **they** would like this grant.

The Swan Youth Project

The Swan Youth Project aspires to create appropriate settings that facilitate the growth and development of the children and young people from West Norfolk.

In February 2022, The Swan Youth Project applied for a **Momentum activity grant of £490** to use as support to pay for transport in relation to their planned residential trip to Kingswood. Thanks to the grant they spent 3 days and 2 nights at the **Kingswood centre**, taking part in many activities which the young people enjoyed. This awesome case study shows just how Momentum grants can be used to help support young people to grow in **confidence** and really **bond** as a small group, whilst improving **social skills**, and a feeling of **belonging**.


